Dear Friends:


I am proud to be part of a community that supports its public schools, and part of an organization that works as hard as the Lawrence Schools Foundation does. The Foundation succeeded, again, in 2005 in accomplishing our mission of “. . . enriching the education provided to all students by the Lawrence Public Schools.” As you read this report, I think you will appreciate the growth of our existing programs in 2005, and new efforts, such as our collaboration with MusicWorks! to raise money to enhance the public school music programs in Lawrence.

Income from contributions to the Foundation increased 24% over 2004. During 2006, the Foundation will need to raise even more to maintain the Early Childhood Readiness Program due to cutbacks in state and federal funding. Although every program we support in the Lawrence Public Schools is important, the early childhood program is particularly so. Substantial research confirms that children who are well prepared when they start school are more successful throughout their educational careers, and \$1 of support *now* saves society \$17 down the road. I encourage you to visit the Early Childhood Family Center. You will be amazed at the work that is being done every day to prepare these children for success in school and in life.

Our priorities in 2006 are the Early Childhood Readiness Program, Teacher Innovation Grants, and Funds for Excellence which include funds for library/technology, academics, arts, athletics and the greatest needs.

Thank you to our school families, loyal alumni, community supporters and new donors in 2005. We want to ensure that the gifts we receive from you are invested well and spent wisely. Selection of scholarship recipients, educator grants and awards, and critical support of the early childhood education program is made with our mission in mind. Your continued support is vital and much appreciated.

## Foundation Programs

### *Early Childhood Education*

The Lawrence Public Schools' **Readiness Program** provides a critical piece of the puzzle for early childhood education in this community. More than 108 at-risk 4-year-olds receive a full day of curriculum, meals, exercise and care at no cost to their families. Approximately one-third of this program's support, or nearly \$155,000, was provided by the Lawrence Schools Foundation in 2005 through annual giving by local benefactors and private foundations.

### *Teacher Grants*

Interactive e-instruction for 1st and 2nd graders, a visiting landscape artist for secondary art students, mentoring programs for 10th graders and more were funded in 2005 with \$12,000 in **Teacher Innovation Grants** from the Foundation. Our teachers' dreams for enrichment in their classrooms are unlimited, depending on your support.

The "Prize Patrol" surprised seven more teachers in April 2005 with **Carl Knox Staff Development Grants** for their continuing education. The Foundation awarded a total of \$4,500 so that our students benefit from the best teaching methods and knowledge available.

Thirteen motivated district employees spent one evening a month with Randy Weseman, superintendent of schools, for **leadership development** sessions and the opportunity to network with community leaders. Each participant received a \$500 leadership grant and a \$500 stipend from the Foundation.
